THE YEAR IN REVIEW

As 2019 comes to a close, we at SEDA would like to highlight a few exciting projects that were completed in our community.

GARY PAXTON INDUSTRIAL PARK - The Gary Paxton Industrial Park deep water dock served our fleet well. We saw a significant YOY increase in usage from 2018 to 2019 and the community continues to utilize this resource even in the off-season.

Additionally, the newly established Northline Seafoods retrofitted their fish processing barge and successfully launched the barge for processing in Bristol Bay.

Also, Eckert Fine Beverages has been using Blue Lake Water to make Rain Cane Vodka. They are in the development stage of their business and we hope more water is exported in the future.

Lastly, The City & Borough of Sitka divested itself of both the former Administration Building and former Utility Dock. Both new owners are hopeful they will be able to utilize these assets to create beneficial resources or services for the community. We look forward to seeing what they have up their sleeves.

KATLIAN BAY ROAD PROJECT- The Katlian Bay Road Project is underway. This new nine mile, single lane gravel road will provide increased recreational and subsistence opportunities on Baranof Island within U.S. Forest Service (USFS) Sitka Ranger District managed lands, Native Corporation (Shee Atika) lands, and potential new material sources on State, Federal and Native Corporation lands for possible future development.

LOOKING AHEAD TO 2020

SEDA is excited about all that 2020 has in store. Most notably, the potential establishment of a Marine Service Center at The Gary Paxton Industrial Park. 


