




Population Age Demographics

















Private Sector Employment Industry Sectors 2016


Average Monthly Employment


Average Annual Monthly



Education & Health represent 17% of Sitka's workforce.

Vs. Average monthly 2016 Wage for all private industry payroll jobs = \$3,268




Manufacturing represents 7% of Sitka's workforce.


Retail Private Payroll Employment

Average Annual Monthly





Total Payroll by Industry







Government: Federal, State & Local Estimated change in 3rd Qtr. payroll 2007 vs. 2017







Historical View of Sitka's Fisheries - Volume & Value




Seafood - Primary Industry Harvest by Local Permit Holders




Seafood - Primary Industry





CBS Raw Fish Tax Revenues






